## Reflection on stories shared in the Presentation

Worship and the maintenance of contacts within fellowships and beyond had been varied. We were invited to consider

- ✚ what has been learned, and what can be retained?
- ✚ how can we move forward into a changed world where the old familiar experience of going to church is likely to be different for a long time?

Many useful comments were made resulting in a request that discussions should be held in elders and church groups and that feedback and proposals be shared. They included the following:

- How can we use the lockdown experience to reach those who do not normally come into church?
- The need to cater for those who feel inclined NOT to go into a church.
- The need to think of the church as a body of people coming together.
- As a partnership we have a number of small churches – are there ways of sharing resources and working together?
- Weekly hard copy worship resources shared.
- Zoom had been very useful to a number of churches.
- Bible studies could be shared via Zoom.
- Services in churches live filmed on zoom.
- Services loaded on to YouTube.
- A way of ending the divide always evident between those who can physically get to church and those who for various reasons cannot.
- Zoom services need to be shorter and more focused.
- Zoom as a Mission tool can be used to reach younger people.
- How can we provide a mixture of opportunities for people?

There is much that the churches can do to move forward, we are encouraged not to sit and wait but to make those moves which seem right in each particular situation always making such decisions sensitively and prayerfully seeking God's way for us.
