

Plastics - Where are we now?

Over the last 2 years we, as a Church, have taken part in The Big Plastic Count and sent our results to the government. It showed that only 17% of the plastic used in our lives is recycled. 11% goes to landfill, 58% is incinerated, and 14% is exported.

Every year around 12 million tonnes of plastic enter our oceans.

Plastic waste is an especially serious symptom of over-consumption. There may now be more than 5 trillion pieces of plastic – both larger pieces and so-called microplastics – floating in our seas, which have a devastating effect on marine species and biodiversity. Microplastic particles find their way into our food, water, and even our bloodstreams.

Half of all the plastics ever produced have been made in the last 15 years, and production is growing. At each stage of its life cycle, plastic can harm our health, through exposure to plastic particles themselves and chemicals used in their manufacture.

We need to move beyond consume-and-throwaway systems towards circular approaches that work within ecological limits. This means reusing, recycling and sharing materials and products.

What difference can we make?

- Do we feel caught up in a culture of compulsive consumerism?
 What changes could we make in our lifestyle?
- Every product and service has both an ecological and social footprint. By choosing our purchases carefully and responsibly we can protect both people and planet.
- How can we use citizens' power to spur governments and the private sector to reduce ecological impacts?

Food for thought this Christmas.

A STORY FROM 2024

The land at the edge of Stainbeck's car park and round the back of Angel's Nursery is unregistered land. It has been overgrown and constantly suffered from fly tipping for as long as we can remember. We often made plans and tried for a grant or two but sadly have never had the resources, money or people, to make good use of it.

But change is always possible!

First **Team Beckhills:** remember how, with the support of Leeds Citizens and Stainbeck Church, Team Beckhills successfully secured support from the Council for new steps and lighting for the estate? A great job and well done.

What next? Well litter was the main cry and clean ups began (yet again!) ... and then of course Covid, after which Team Beckhills morphed into My Community United, a new broader group of residents wanting to tidy up the area. Alongside this, InterACT obtained an ABCD (Asset Based Community Development) Grant.

These two things came together when one of the Beckhill residents became increasingly involved with a local **Incredible Edible** Group based in Meanwood:

Incredible Edible's vision is to create kind, confident and connected communities through the power of food, with an amazing strapline line "If you eat, you're in!"

As we talked about community assets, about what resources we already had in the area, this resident was pleased to talk more positively about what is POSSIBLE and not what's wrong.



And so **Lynn Brown** has been the driving force behind setting up the garden, using the knowledge and skills she's picked up elsewhere and an amazing amount of personal energy to get things going. Thank you Lynn!

She's used funding that we hold as part of our ABCD work that residents can "apply" for, as well as funding from other sources. She has bought the various planters, seeds and soil. We've received

lots of freebies, mostly in the form of labour and wood chippings, and more importantly, she's connected with other people on and off the estate who want to join her. As they work, people walk by, strike up conversations, harvest food and share stories. The latest addition is a Vegetable Cupboard donated by 'Leeds Feeds'. (https://feedleeds.org)

It's not a forgotten patch any more!

Work on the garden continues almost daily – different people taking on different tasks such as watering on a regular basis.

Also, **community action days** have been a great way to bring larger groups of people together. These have been held in school holidays to allow children to get involved. There are lots of budding gardeners and diggers out there!

But that is not all as **David Keighley's** been involved too, and has connected us with **Litter Free Leeds**. They describe themselves in this way: **Litter Free Leeds** brings communities, groups and individuals together to be good role models of what can be achieved when we all work together (https://litterfreeleeds.co.uk).

So, whilst some dig and plant, some walk the estate and pick litter. There are lots of ways to connect, but eating together has always been a great part of these days. Watch this space – better still why not join in?
