I've been in post for a few months now and I hope I'm getting to grips with things. I've spent quite a bit of time going through the compliance certificates we hold and arranging renewal for those about to expire. The Gas Safety Check has been done, as have the Fire Alarm/Fire detection and Emergency Lighting certificates. Fire Extinguishers and Fire Blanket checks are due in December and Portable Appliance Testing (PAT) is due in May. All current and past certificates and documents are now in MAP under 'Compliance'.

I've also been contacting all our hirers and introducing myself as their new point of contact. There have also been various enquiries from potential new hirers, to which I have responded in consultation with Nicola and Angela.

Angela has sent me instructions for printing the Outlook magazine, so I now do that each month. Getting to know the printer/photocopier is a job in itself, but I can now scan documents, after various tech support phone calls to the printer company and help from Adrian, which is very useful. I still need to get properly familiar with how invoicing works here and Emmanuelle is helping with that handover.

I've been made very welcome and I hope I will continue to be able to take some of the admin burden off people who are already doing so much. I am still having to ask a lot of questions, but everyone has been so helpful and supportive.


